**Comment Period on Proposed Changes
Sept. 1 – Sept. 30, 2010**

Under the authority of the federal Resource Conservation and Recovery Act (RCRA), U.S. Environmental Protection Agency Region 5 is proposing to phase out the pump-and-treat system used to clean polluted underground water supplies at the Dana Corp. facility in Roscoe. The Dana site was formerly known as Warner Electric. The pump-and-treat system has been operating since 1991, but tests show the underground water (“ground water” in environmental terms) is now meeting drinking water standards and treatment is no longer needed. Before EPA makes a final decision on altering the 1989 cleanup plan that called for the ground water treatment system, the Agency will review written public comments submitted Sept. 1 to Sept. 30, 2010.
