Introduction

This Final Decision and Response to Comments is presented by the United States Environmental Protection Agency (U.S. EPA) for the Clean Harbors of Cleveland facility located in Cleveland, Ohio. It consists of the Final Decision, previously issued Statement of Basis (Attachment I), Response to Comments (Attachment II), and Index to Administrative Record (Attachment III).

This Final Decision selects the final remedy to be implemented at the Clean Harbors facility, based on the Administrative Record and comments received from the public. The Statement of Basis provides the proposed remedy and was available for public review and comment from September 14 through October 30, 2006.

Assessment of the Facility

The response action documented in this Final Decision is necessary to protect human health and the environment.

Selected Remedy

U.S. EPA has selected the following remedial components as the remedy to address contaminated media at the Clean Harbors facility:

- Institutional controls placed on the property

The remedy selected in this Final Decision is the same as the remedy that was proposed in the Statement of Basis dated August 2006. Institutional controls are necessary at the Clean Harbors facility in order to protect human health. The institutional controls will insure that the property is only used for industrial purposes (please refer to Attachment 1, Statement of Basis, for further information).

Public Participation Activities and Comments

A 30 day public comment period was held from September 14, 2006 through October 30, 2006. No comments were received on this Statement of Basis.

Administrative Record

The Administrative Record upon which the final remedy was selected is available at the Cleveland Public Library-Main Branch and the 7th Floor Records Center at the U.S. EPA, Region 5 office. Attachment III identifies the documents contained within the Administrative Record.

Future Actions

No future actions are anticipated.
