



The U.S. Environmental Protection Agency is issuing a Public Notice

The United States Environmental Protection Agency (U.S. EPA) is proposing to issue a Hazardous Waste Management Permit under the Resource Conservation and Recovery Act (RCRA). This permit would be issued to Lone Star Industries, Inc. for its cement kiln unit located at 3301 South County Road 150 West in Greencastle, Indiana.

Lone Star stores hazardous waste derived fuel in tanks and containers and then burns that fuel in a rotary cement kiln to facilitate the production of cement. Lone Star operates a cement kiln unit regulated under the Boiler Industrial Furnace (BIF) requirements

A public notice will appear on March 23, 2007, in the Legal Section of the Terre Haute Tribune Star Newspaper and a radio announcement can be heard on WIBC AM 1070 radio station (Indianapolis) on March 23, 2007, between 6:00a.m. and 10:00a.m. You can obtain information on the draft permit at the EPA Region 5 website. <http://www.epa.gov/reg5rcra/wptdiv/permits/index.htm>.

You may request that the U.S. EPA hold a public hearing about this permit. At a hearing, you would have an opportunity to submit written comments, ask questions, make statements and otherwise discuss any concerns about the permit with U.S. EPA staff. If a public hearing is held, U.S. EPA will make a separate announcement of the date, time, and location of that hearing/meeting 30 days in advance.
