Attached is a copy of a draft memo I have written concerning the Centralia Power Plant, about which we have had recent telephone conversations. As you know, a potential SO₂ SIP revision is in the works. The local agency, Southwest Air Pollution Control Authority, has drafted an order requiring the Company (Pacific Power and Light) to perform some monitoring and modeling. In the third part of the draft memo I have made several recommendations concerning meteorological and air quality monitoring needed to develop data bases to support a SIP attainment demonstration. Please review these recommendations, and provide specific comments to me as soon as possible, on or before August 10, 1988.

In particular, I am interested in the Model Clearinghouse and TTW comments on the meteorological monitoring. Also, I have admittedly not made recommendations with a Federal Land Manager's perspective, so I need the NPS and USFS input. If you have questions, call me at (206) 442-1531 or FTS 399-1531.
