The thirteenth annual International Symposium on the "Measurement of Toxic and Related Air Pollutants" co-sponsored by the U. S. Environmental Protection Agency's **National Exposure Research Laboratory** and the **Air and Waste Management Association** will be held at the Embassy Suites, Cary NC.
