

Foreword

The publication of this directory of American beet sugar companies was delayed by the fact changes in the industry's senior executive ranks have been taking place with some frequency, and even changes in the internal structure of several companies have occurred.

We go to press now at least semi-confident this directory will remain an accurate, up-to-date resource for some time, but also recognizing that change is a constant factor in this country's beet sugar processing industry.

Significant changes also have taken place in the nation's sugar policy, as evidenced in the seven-year omnibus farm legislation approved by the U.S. Congress in 1996. Enactment of the 1996 farm bill brought about dramatic sugar policy reforms, such as elimination of domestic marketing controls — a move that will reduce government involvement in the commerce of sugar. The level of import access to the U.S. sugar market by foreign suppliers effectively was increased 20 percent, and the downside safety net on domestic producer prices was removed whenever this higher level of imports is not realized. The basic, government loan rate for sugar, which had remained constant for more than a decade, was reduced by the imposition of a one-cent-per-pound penalty should sugar under loan be forfeited to government ownership. Meanwhile, the marketing assessment, a special tax on sales of domestically-produced sugar, was increased 25 percent.

Within a few months of its enactment, the new law was contested legislatively by sugar policy antagonists and indications are these challenges will continue.

How unilateral adoption of these reforms in U.S. sugar policy plays out, as negotiators embark on yet another round of international trade liberalization talks, will present even more challenges in the years ahead.

The men and women listed on the following pages will continue to provide the leadership to meet these tests and, at the same time, manage their companies in a manner that will continue to assure U.S. consumers an abundant supply of sugar at a fair and reasonable price.

We are proud to be associated with them.





Sugarbeets: Acreage Harvested Crop Years 1993-1996






