CONTACT SUMMARY: Mr. Cooney was contacted to determine if oil-fired kilns are still used in the brick manufacturing industry. Data from a 1990 survey of the member companies indicate that in 1990, only one oil-fired plant was operating, and Mr. Cooney is unsure if that plant is still operating. He did note that the trend in the industry is towards gas-fired kilns. Of the plants that responded to the survey, 120 were gas-fired, 16 were coal-fired, 15 were sawdust-fired, and 1 was oil-fired. Thirty-one plants have oil as a standby fuel.
