Several of the northeast States have inquired about an unclear section of the table contained in the attachment to my July 22, 1992 memorandum to you, "Guidelines for State Implementation Plan (SIP) Submittals Due November 15, 1992." This memorandum corrects the table and clarifies the Environmental Protection Agency's (EPA) expectations for ozone transport region SIP submittals.

The table lists major required State submittals, and indicates whether a full submittal is expected or if a committal SIP is acceptable. Under the Ozone Transport Region subheading, the submittal requirements are listed in two groups. Due to an oversight, no indicators were provided for the first group [which includes volatile organic compounds (VOC) reasonably available control technology (RACT), nitrogen oxides (NOx) RACT, and new source review (NSR) requirements] to show whether full or committal SIP's are expected. In addition, no line was drawn between the first and second groups. Therefore, some have questioned whether the marking under the committal SIP column, intended for the second group [enhanced inspection and maintenance (I/M)], is referring to both groups. To clarify EPA's guidelines on ozone transport region submittals, EPA expects full submittals for VOC RACT and NSR requirements. The EPA will approve a committal SIP for NOx RACT only in cases where credible photochemical grid modeling has not been completed and where modeling efforts are under way. The EPA will accept committal SIP's for enhanced I/M.

A corrected table is attached. The original table has been replaced by the corrected table on the Office of Air Quality, Planning and Standards' Technology Transfer Network bulletin board.
