New NAAQS in Florida

- 2009 Ozone NAAQS, means Florida needs a new motto.
- Our current motto, “Florida is one of three states east of the Mississippi that can meet all air quality standards” won’t fit anymore.







Transportation Conformity

- The 2008 ozone standard would effect 2 MSAs
 - Tampa, who has been nonattainment for ozone and
 - Pensacola, who has been closest to nonattainment and very active in environmental regulations
- At 70 or anything lower, communities with no idea of transportation conformity get involved
- The time for regional multi-pollutant approaches to SIPs is here, much more effective than county-by-county, pollutant-by-pollutant






Monitoring Impacts

- As proposed, the NO₂ standard would require 14 roadside monitors
- If the expected lead monitoring for sources changes to monitor at half ton sources, it adds 11 airports
 - At this point, there is no modeling protocol for airports, and some monitoring shows that exceedances are possible at airports with less than half ton lead emissions
